A New Municipal Vault at the Utilities Office

Further Steps in Consolidating Municipal Offices in One Centre — War Services Urges Collection of Animal Fat and Bones—Report Given by Municipal Officer Harrop on Collection of Poll and Dog Taxes.

Acton Council met in regular session on Tuesday evening when councillors E. Jones, J. M. McDonald, and F. Davison were present; and Reeve J. B. Chalmers presided.

In the absence of Clerk C. F. Leatherland, Municipal Officer E. Harrop acted as Clerk.

Before confirming the minutes of the regular and special meetings of council, Councillor McDonald drew attention of council to the omission of the motion accepting the resignation of treasurer E. Thetford at the meeting on August first and this was ordered to be included.

A letter from Acton Fall Fair requested a continuance of council's support of the fair and the annual grant. This request was granted.

A letter from the Department of War Services urged that the municipality arrange for the collection of all animal fats and bones. Instructions were given as to how they might be collected and sold. The matter was given to the attention of the salvage committee. The feeling was that this committee could best handle this matter and was splendidly done.

A letter from Mr. F. L. Wright of the Imperial Insurance Co. gave information regarding the fidelity bonds on Treasurers E. T. Thetford and Miss B. H. Speight. The burglary insurance on the Public Utilities office could be endorsed to cover the municipality as well as the Commission. The coverage as outlined in the letter was satisfactory.

Correspondence was read regarding the payment of hospital fees of Mrs. Jean Smith, an indigent patient in Toronto General Hospital. Council agreed to accept responsibility for this account of \$344.75 and forwarded a resolution to this effect to County Council.

A letter from the Department of Municipal Affairs gave information regarding the Unemployment Insurance Act. It was the opinion of the Department given in this letter that the municipality was not liable under the Act. The matter was left over until another meeting.

Another letter was received from the Ontario Municipal Board stating there were no documents filed with the Board regarding the annexation of Beardmore Crescent.

A copy of letter sent to the Medical Officer of Health pointed out the need for a more thorough administration of diphtheria toxoid to the children. A report was requested from the medical officer of health as it was felt the figures given for Acton were in error. A copy of the letter was also to be sent to the School Board. A by-law appointing a tax collector and treasurer for the village of Acton for the balance of the year was read as required and passed. Miss B. H. Speight was appointed to this position. The municipality will pay the Utilities Commission the actual cost of the work and the commission will arrange for hiring what additional help is necessary.

Municipal Officer Harrop reported that to date \$102 had been collected this year for dog taxes and about \$1. Concluded on Page Five.

Application Made For Registration Of Fund From Acton

Application has been made to the Minister of National War Service for registration of "The Acton Fair Fund for the London, England Children's Hospital." This is in accordance with the provisions of the War Charities Act which requires that all funds having for its object or among its objects, any purpose charitable or otherwise, arising out of or connected with the war, may be registered and comply with the regulation.

The officers in charge of the fund will be Reeve J. B. Chalmers, chairman, ex-Warden Amos Mason, Vice-Chairman, Mr. W. K. Graham, treasurer and Mr. G. A. Dills, Secretary. The account for the deposit of money will be in the Acton Branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia.

Just as soon as the fund is registered and the certificate of registration is received the fund will be open for subscription and Acton will have its own individual fund to help the children of the hospital in London England that has suffered through bombardment of the Huns.

Before the books are opened the fund has subscriptions promised of \$31.00. These will be acknowledged and each week's contributions will be acknowledged through the columns of *The Free Press*. We will let you know just as soon as the certificate of registration is received.
