For the first time in 27 years Canadian pro golfers proved a real threat in the Canadian Open Golf championship at Lambton Golf Club (Toronto) Aug. 7-8-9. At the end of 54 holes Sam Sneed, who won Canadian championship in 1939 and last year, was tied for first place with Bob Gray, Jr. of Toronto, but Sneed, shooting sub-par golf nosed out Gray by two strokes. Canadians however had the satisfaction of winning the runner-up prize and, including this, capturing three out of the first five cash awards.
