Most of us Acton boys are together in one platoon, we have been moving several times since we come here. At present we have been transferred into the First Division which was quite a jump for us.

Our meals are very good, and seems to be the main thing. We are getting used to this country now and it makes it a lot easier for us. The country is wonderful where we are now, everything is nice and fresh.

We have been hearing fairly regular from home and that is the main thing. We have had some parcels from home and when we get them, it seems like a Christmas gift.

Just a short note to thank you for favors past. I have received paper regularly for the last sixteen months and I assure you it means a lot to the boys when we receive our papers from home and it makes us feel nearer to the old town.

We had a wonderful voyage only for one instance, we continued our way and at last arrived in our camp, which is a really lovely spot in England.

About three weeks after we arrived Col. G. Drew visited my Battery and gave us a warm feeling of friendship. He was in the 16th Battery part of the last war and he gave us the history of our Battery. We were... for two weeks on the range and we had a lot of hard work, but also a good time.
