Weekly War Commentary

The Japanese attack on the Aleutian Islands seems to have been a logical development of the small air attack on Dutch Harbor, presumably designed to forestall an offensive against Japan by the United Nations through the chain of islands which points to Japan.

Attu Landing Reports at the week-end indicated that a small enemy force landed on the island of Attu, at the tip of the Aleutian archipelago. These, it is believed, will be mopped up within a reasonable time.

Heavy defeats inflicted on the Japanese in the naval battles of the Coral Sea and at Midway Island may be expected to have a disastrous effect on attempts to reinforce the enemy in the Aleutians.

Threat to B. C. Once ashore in a territory well known to them—they have undoubtedly surveyed it well and provided themselves with U. S.
