Royal Canadian Mounted Police Men who are not in a medical category now being called for service in the Active Army are asked to volunteer for service as special constables in the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

Commissioner S. T. Wood, who issued the call this week pointed out that the Order-in-Council which gives the Minister of National War Services power to call out men in the lower medical brackets for special security guard duty will not be implemented "for the time being."

"Rather than implement this Order-in-Council by compulsory service," the government has decided for the time being to give those men who have in the past, and who may in the future wish to volunteer for such service, an opportunity to do so," the Commissioner's statement reads.

Those who are subject to National War Service Registration but of a low medical category, (B1, B2, C1) as well as others who wished to serve, should communicate with him in Ottawa, he added.

"The rates of pay and allowances which will be paid for this work are identical with those paid in the Canadian Active Army," Commissioner Wood's statement concluded.

Clareholm, Alta., Aug. 11th, 1942.

Dear Mr. Dilla: At last I have found enough time and ambition to write a few lines and thank you for sending me The Free Press every week. I look forward to receiving it every Monday and read of what's happening around home. Also it's a means of finding out just where all the fellows I knew and worked with are stationed.

We are stationed about eighty miles south of Calgary in the foothills of the Rockies. The country around here is nice but different in some respects to that around home. We have a lot of fellows on this station from Ontario and other eastern provinces and that being the case, the old argument about the east and the west goes on and on.

Most of the fellows spend their week-ends in Calgary or Lethbridge and some go to Edmonton. Also when a fellow can gather enough money he spends a very enjoyable week-end in Banff. I visited Banff about a month ago with a couple of friends and it is about the most beautiful place I have visited yet. The scenery is wonderful and also swimming in the sulphur hot springs is the object of most everyone's visit. I think the view from the Banff springs hotel, one mile up in the Rockies, is about the best view of all. You can stand on the terrace and look down into the Bow River valley and really marvel at the scenery.

As you probably know flying is carried on every day and nearly every hour of the day as long as weather permits. By doing this a pilot has a fairly large number of hours—to his credit by the time he has finished his course and receives his wings. For myself I get up the odd time on test flights to check on instruments that can't be checked on the ground. Every day we go up we receive seventy-five cents flying pay so that means we have to take turns in the section and each one gets an equal amount of flying in.

Well Mr. Dilla this is about all I have time to write about just now. Again many thanks for sending me The Free Press and also keep the good work in keeping the boys supplied with the news from home in your paper.
