

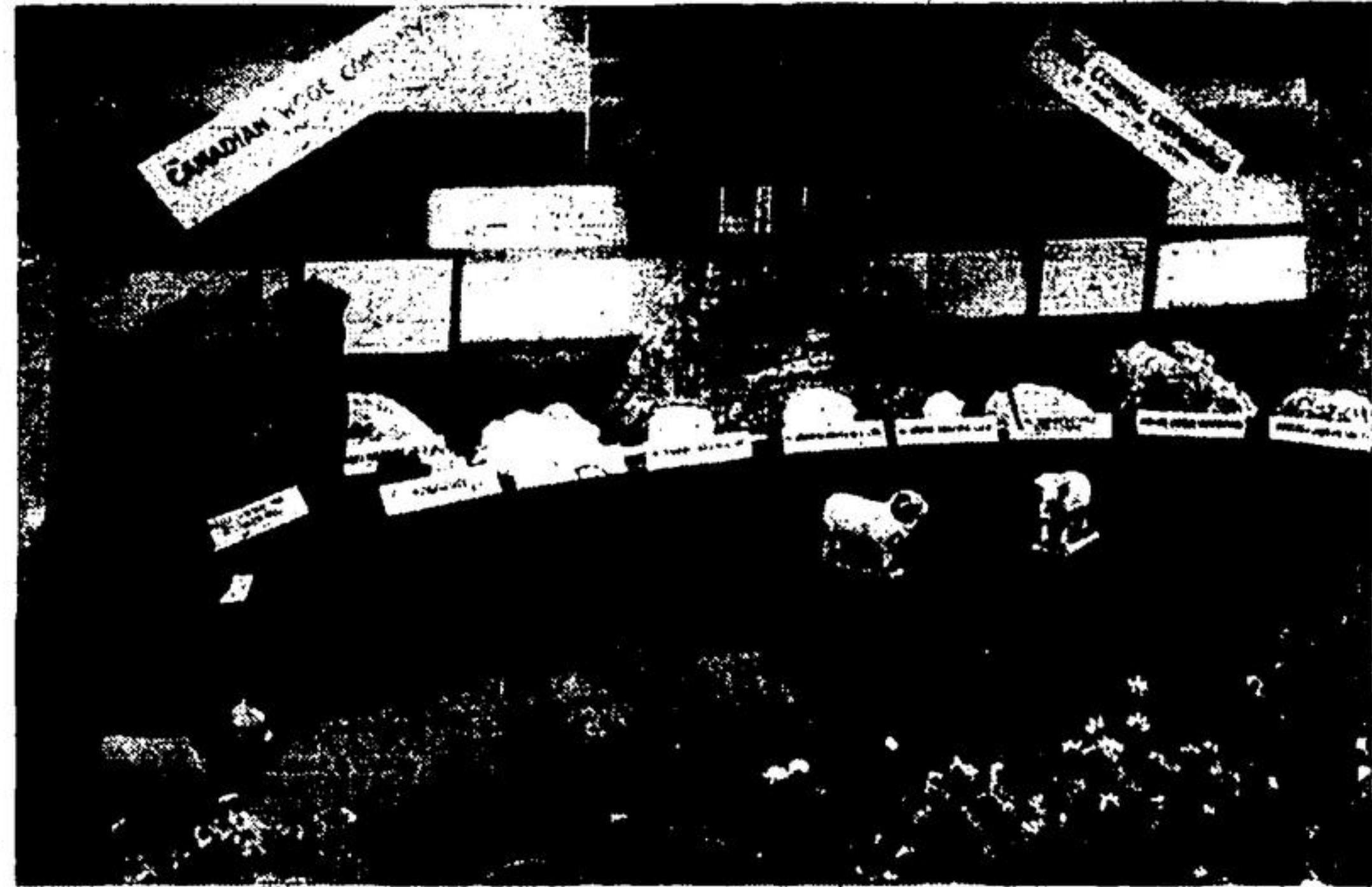
# Local Picture Review of Year 1942

Acton Y's Men's Club Entertain Acton Youth at Banquet and Presentation in Month of May



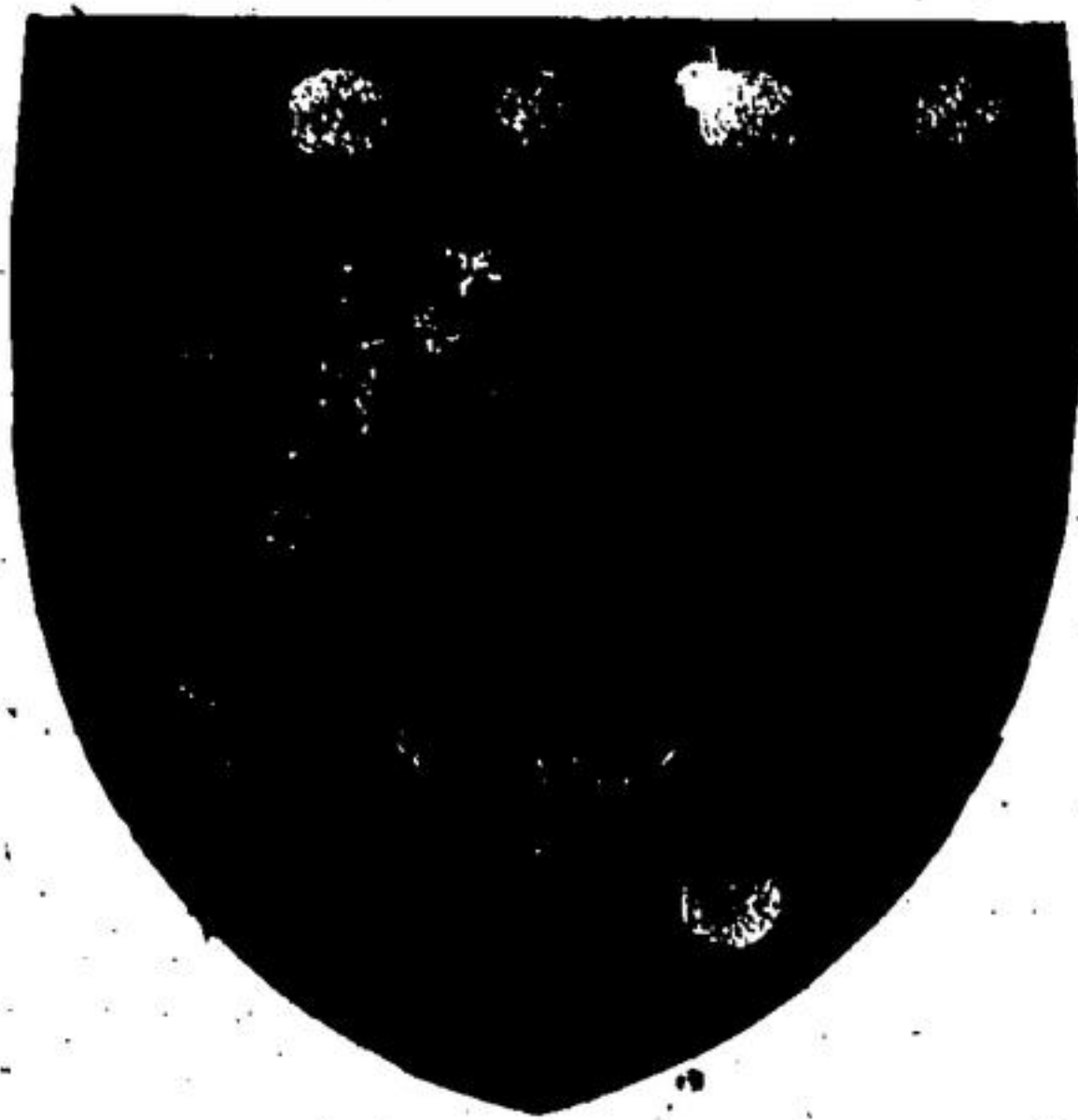
Sgt. Edward A. Anderson, reported in September "believed killed in action over Germany.
