We are stationed on a huge estate owned by one of England's wealthiest residents. The buildings were built in 1827 and have a real historic background.

A statue of marble entitled "Venus Reclining" is the most realistic work I have seen. The sheets on the bed have perfect creases and really have to touch it to be certain.

The owner has lent part of the estate to the War Office, therefore hence we are here. Many famous regiments have been here before us and we feel quite proud to be here.

Life goes on as usual and as always waiting for our break. Had a letter from Sgt. McGeehan and was glad to hear from him. Saw in the Army News a picture of the "Acton Bomber" and was the first of its type to fly the Atlantic.

Halton Breeders Outstanding at Oakville Show

Halton Halstein breeders met only maintained but added to their legends at the Oakville championship show on October 8. They were particularly outstanding in the male classes and their entries topped no less than four of the six classes.

In the female classes, Marley Watson of Teasdale, and Robinson Bros. of Georgetown, were sixth and seventh respectively in the aged cow class which brought out 21 entries.

THE DECISION of Liberal members of the Ontario legislature to co-operate with the Progressive Conservative administration during the next session of the provincial house has drawn the attention of C. C. F. Leader Joffe that Ontario has a coalition of the two older parties in all but name.

Mr. Joffe charged that certain Liberals continued to dispense "patronage without which the old party machines cannot function."

The August 4 election got back into the news with the announcement by provincial election officials that they still are not able to announce the proxy vote cast on behalf of Ontario residents who were outside the province at the time of the election.
