

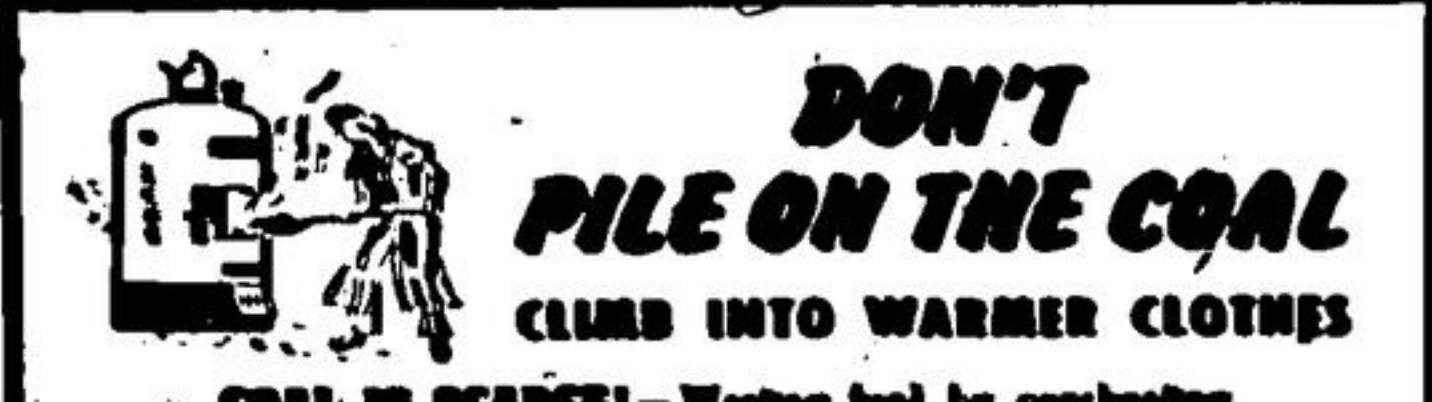

First Election Here Since 1939 Seven for Council

He was proud to be a citizen of Acton, proud of Acton's municipal record and the co-operation of all citizens in such a splendid war record, with administration of funds of over \$200,000 a year. He felt the responsibility of Council work. Mr. Mason expressed appreciation of the confidence the citizens had placed in him for many years.

Councillor Oakes gave a detailed statement of the work done and the money spent on streets and walks in his department. There had been 331 linear feet of new sidewalk and 305 feet of new drain laid as well as 12 catch basins installed. He appreciated the co-operation of Council and officials in the work of his department.

Councillor C. Kirkness appreciated his name in nomination again and expressed his willingness to contest the office. He told of the work done at the Town Hall and Park and complimented Councillor Oakes on the street work. He announced his intention of running for a Council seat again and said he would be proud to be beaten by any of the contestants for the office.

G. A. Dills, Chairman of the School Board, gave an outline of the work accomplished at the school during the past two years. There had been repairs and improvement of the building and facilities. The inspectors reports of the work being done were very complimentary. Further improvements were contemplated but hampered by present restrictions. Like other speakers, he was willing to answer any questions, possible about school matters. He appreciated the co-operation of the Board members, officials

and staff in his work of Chairman the past year. J. E. MacArthur of the Public Utilities Commission, on behalf of Chairman C. Hansen, gave a detailed report on the Hydro and Waterworks Departments. He told of service given and gave comparative figures on the use of hydro and water in Acton; told of investments, new equipment secured, total costs of the two branches and outlined some of the work planned for the post-war period. Mr. Hansen, he explained, was unable to be present on account of illness.

The only two members for Council present were Messrs. Geo. Fleasman and Frederick Hunter. Both expressed a desire to gain Council experience and if elected to office would do their best in the position.

The singing of the National Anthem closed the meeting. Copies of the interim financial report were available for all and citizens generally appreciated the splendid financial position shown for Acton.
