YOUNG PEOPLES RALLY

A most interesting and unique service was held in the Baptist Church Sunday evening when the Young People's groups of the local churches united in a service of Fellowship and Praise.

The service opened with a sing-song led by Ken Gilliepe with Chas. Lanchester at the piano. Following the introductory prayer, Wilma West, president of the R. Y. P. U., welcomed the guests and introduced the guest speaker. Miss Dora Hansen, representing the Knox Guild, sang "God is Love" accompanied by Mrs. C. Cade. The scripture lesson was read by Miss Esther Taylor, of St. Albans; Charles Burt of Hillside; E. Y. P. U. led in prayer. Charles Lanchester played a concert piece "Absent" with Mrs. E. W. Anderson as accompanist.

Ken Gilliepe of McMaster University, Hamilton, was the guest speaker. Mr. Gilliepe is the Devotions Director of the R. Y. P. BATHED GOODS

Neighbours can swap a cup of sugar or a pinch of tea over the back fence without feeling they are indulging in an illegal action. The rationing order has now been clarified along lines similar to the recent amendment in the British rationing regulations.

The provision now governing neighbourly exchanges is: "Rationed goods which have lawfully been gained by a consumer as authorized by this order may be used or consumed by such consumer or members of his household without restriction or may be transferred to another person by way of a mutual gift, loan or exchange but must not be sold."
