New Export Lamb — Shipments of lamb are now being made to the United Kingdom ...

The Canadian Meat Board will purchase only supplies which develop in the Dominion and officials state that no estimate of probable shipments is possible at present.

Mr. Gardiner said that the prices which the board are offering at auction for lamb carcasses meeting export specifications are equivalent to the following return per 100 pounds in various zones across the Dominion: Montreal, \$24.75; Ottawa, \$25.00; Winnipeg, \$23.50; Saskatoon, \$23.25; Alberta, \$23.00.

These prices will advance by 50 cents per 100 pounds on March 30, with a similar and final increase effective on and after April 24.

In one broad statement in the House of Commons, Maritime Minister Howe defined the Canadian Government's policy on both domestic and international air transport.

The Dominion scheme would give all countries a chance to share in a world plan, would provide new freedom of the air by agreement and would disown Canadian airlines from ownership and operation by railways. Also, to insure Canadian airlines a supply of equipment after the war, rights to manufacture in Canada a four-engine transport aircraft ...

PRICE CONTROL AND RATIONING INFORMATION

Typical questions consumers ask of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board this week are answered by the central Ottawa Consumer Branch Committee.

Q.—I have a six roomed house which is now vacant. It was rented at \$1600 per month. The tenants left it in such bad condition I will have to spend considerable money repairing it. It would not pay me to re-rent at this price. How can I get a higher rental for it?

A.—If you are planning to repair the house and feel that you should have a higher rental, application for increased rental must be filed with the Rentals Administrator of the Board. Their appraisal will call and investigate your case.

Q.—I sent my child to the grocery store to buy butter and she refused to buy it as the child had these coupons. It do not like to buy.

the ration books with a child. Was my grocery correct? A.—Your grocery is quite correct, it is illegal to deal in these coupons, these coupons are invalid.

Q.—Last week it was changed 25c for a 2 lb. tin of cream soap. Was this price too high? A.—Yes, this price seems high for this product. ... as you have given us the name of the dealer and quoted us many of the prices we have passed your complaint along for investigation.

Q.—I want to sell my automobile. It do not like near a dealer. Where would I find the correct price? A.—There is a selling price on all sales of used cars, the price, of course, depends on the year and model of the car, telephone or write the nearest regional office of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board and they will give you this information, give all the details in your letter.

RATION BOOK 4

WHEN AND WHERE YOU GET IT

Distributing Centres will next be open on all days of next week. Make sure that you know exactly what days and hours the Distributing Centre you intend to go to will be open. Help the volunteer workers by following instructions carefully.

HERE IS WHAT YOU DO TO GET YOUR NEW BOOK

1. Fill in the application card—the first post-card in your Ration Book 3. Do this at home. The application card is printed on card and is numbered RB-93. DO NOT USE ANY OTHER CARD. Follow the method shown.
2. Be sure to PRINT clearly, accurately and completely all information required on the card—including the COUNTY in which you live.
3. Sign at the bottom with your usual signature. Persons of 16 years or over must sign their own cards. Cards of persons under 16 years must be signed by parents or guardians.
4. Applicants must bring their Ration Books with them to the Distributing Centre. Children under 16 may not apply for Ration Books for themselves or for other members of the family.
5. Do not detach application card from your Ration Book. This must be done by an official at the Distributing Centre. If accidentally detached, bring the application card along with your Ration Book.
6. ARMED FORCES: All members of the Armed Forces, whether on permanent subsistence or not, will obtain their Ration Cards from their own Units.
7. APPLYING FOR BOOKS FOR OTHERS: Any responsible member of a household may apply for Ration Books on behalf of other members of the household, or for neighbours unable to apply in person, providing Ration Book 3 with properly filled in application card is presented.

On presentation at a Distributing Centre of your Ration Book 3, with properly completed application card, you will be issued your new Ration Book 4; and your Ration Book 3 will be returned to you.

WARNING: Be sure you get your new book while your Distributing Centre is open next week. Otherwise, you will not be able to obtain your new book until April 17.
