THE GREAT CLIPS OF DOVER

There was the day we were taken to Dover, which is the nearest point on the coast to France. I had seen Dover back in the days of the first World War, for I dove with the high white cliffs of the night of the British. In the days before the war travelers visited Dover from all parts of the globe and dived in the water to see the cliffs towering white and high above the level of the sea. Today Dover is a fortress. The guns command the channel and the enemy ships that attempt to cross the channel if they do so will be very unfortunate indeed.

The name of Dover will bring back to the minds of our readers the time when the Scherhornet ran the gauntlet successfully. People wondered that such a thing could happen right under the nose of our guns. In those days Dover did not concern the weapon powers with which it has been reinforced today. Even at that time however, the Dover guns made things difficult for the landing. German tanks and out of the tanks fired at the beach at least three times known to have found their mark. The damage done was sufficient to prevent the Scherhornet from putting to sea at that time. Today the enemy does not possess any ships that could go to sea in the channel. Our fighters Captain we tried to only a few months ago went down with his ship in the channel. I still attack ships out of the water to prove the marksmanship of the Dover guns.

As we walked the Dover area we were particularly impressed with the control room from which point the fire of the guns is directed with the aid of the latest instruments. The control room will forever remain a mystery and here the mysteries of the long range shooting were unveiled before our eyes. This alone made the trip to Dover worth while.

We dined at noon in a little restaurant, next door to a small pub where most of the party enjoyed a glass of ale before they set down to one of the best meals we had run into up to that time. The food was well favored and well cooked. While most of the boys were enjoying their ale, two of us found ourselves discussing with some of the workmen, the gun power that protects the English coast at this point. We found that the barrels of these huge guns were being replaced and workmen from the big factory in London were busy making the change over which took some two weeks and was then just about completed.

The working quarters of those who defend Dover are built into the cliffs and long tunnels connect the various rooms which are well ventilated. Here and there the tunnels lead out to the face of the cliff from which advantage point an observer on a clear day may see the coast of France. Indeed they can hear the explosion of the big guns which from time to time shall that area. They know just when to duck and if never pays to be late.

Dover is one of the points from which speed launches patrol the channel under the direction of the R.A.F. when raids are in progress to assist in receiving those who come down the channel. Topped boats are also stationed here and it was the pride of our party to take a run in the channel in both types of boats. The channel is usually choppy but these boats made particularly good times as we dashed along for the French coast for a couple of miles and then turned back to Dover in case the Hun might think we were heading the long looked for attack and start shooting.

The town of Dover has suffered considerably, both from the long range guns on the coast of France and from enemy bombers, but life goes on much as usual. Even the sound of gunfire doesn't seem to disturb the citizens of Dover not as much as it did our members, who, as they reached the defenses, were greeted with an early morning breakfast. At that moment we did not know but what the enemy was taking a pot shot at the inquisitive reporters and no doubt deep in their hearts there were some of our party who were quite ready at that moment to leave the story of Dover unwritten.

On our way to Dover we passed through Folkestone, so familiar to thousands of Canadians. It was just outside Folkestone where our regiment was billeted when we landed in England during the last war. Folkestone was a summer resort in those days and thousands of Londoners spent their holidays there. From the station we could not see that the town suffered much damage but it did look considerably

Farmerette Army Already at Work On Ontario Land

Girls Form Vanguard of Service Forces which Again Will Aid in Alleviating Rural Labor Shortage

TOBACCO (COP) Volunteer help has become a vital factor in Ontario's program for alleviating the farm labor shortage and this year the provincial government is seeking to recruit an even larger force of 100,000 helpers.

Girls again are being asked to do a job on farms and the government plans to place 4,000 on the farm help program in full and complete growing districts in southern Ontario.

Organization and efficiency of the Ontario Farm Service Force have made the girls' service units beginning in 1941 when the department of agriculture asked for 10,000 men and women to give the farmers a hand. 24,000 answered the call. Some went to camps for girls and boys, others became day workers, vacation farmers or "Farm Commandes" who helped with the heavy jobs.

Since then the force has grown steadily. In 1941, 22,000 were asked for 30,000 were enrolled. The force reached the 50,000 mark. Last year the department asked for 100,000 and exceeded the objective.

Already many girls have left school to begin the 13 weeks of farm work necessary to satisfy department of agriculture requirements. The working period in the Y.W.C.A. supervised camps however, is not limited to 13 weeks. Girls in the past have stayed as long as months.

Girls are being asked for their farm work abilities in field and vegetable picking, hoeing and general light work. This season's girls have graduated from early greenhouse work and are now employed in vineyards.

Larger camps organized in accordance with Y.W.C.A. requirements, are complete with supervisors, dormitory arrangements and labor secretaries who see that government regulations are adhered to. Amusement and assistant staff for camp and medical care is available when necessary.

The girls do nothing to do them in the western Ontario. They are being sent to the 50 girls who worked there last year. There will be 100 this season.

Most of the girls are from Aug. 15 to Sept. 23 when the late fruit and vegetable season is in full swing. Although comparatively few applications are turned down, preference is given those who will stay longest and work during that period.

Business girls are encouraged to spend their two weeks' vacation on farms if they can be fitted into the busy season. Last year 1300 were placed for their holidays.

Minimum pay is 25 cents an hour, although for some types of work, girls are paid on a piece work basis. Bursaries \$4.50 per week and the only other expenses are insurance of fund to provide payments for rainy days, and 15 cents a week for health supervision.

MOVING SEEDS (ARE) DISTRIBUTED

Now seeds are introduced on farms with imperfectly cleaned cereals, clover or other commercial seeds, and with commercial feeding stuffs which often contain vital weed seeds, states the National Weed Committee. They are spread from district to district through the various transportation facilities, and are disseminated within a locality in stable manure from towns and cities, and are distributed from farm to farm through the threshing machines and farm field to field by farm implements. The wind carries weed seeds long distances, not only in summer but with drifting soil and over the surface of the snow in winter. Streams distribute them along their courses. They are spread by herbivorous animals and seed feeding birds. Through the stomachs of which pass undigested, or the seeds attach themselves by special contrivances, such as hooked and barbed hairs and spines to passing animals. They are often carried by the boots and clothes of men.

Employees Frozen In Agriculture

Persons employed in agriculture are frozen to the industry, subject to the authority given to such persons to engage in employment outside of agriculture for a period of not more than 60 days in any year where such employment does not interfere with agricultural production, states National Selective Service.

"As a general rule the movement of agricultural workers to employment outside of agriculture must be discouraged, except where the new work is of a seasonal nature, or of the following primary industries: lumbering and logging, forestry, fishing, trapping and mining.

Selective Service points out that every effort should be made to further the policy of retaining agricultural workers in agricultural employment and seasonal employment in the primary industries named.

The District where there is no employment available in certain specified primary industries, a permit of limited duration may be granted to a person employed in agriculture enabling him to take over work during the winter months when his services are not required on the farm, but only rarely should permit be granted unlimited as to time.

Where a permit is granted for a farmer to take temporary employment outside of agriculture, he should be clearly understood that the permit is limited in time and that he is expected to return to agricultural employment immediately after the time period of the permit.

A person employed in agriculture does not require a permit to accept seasonal or temporary employment outside of agriculture in any year when such employment does not interfere with agricultural production.


