SCALDING ADVANCES VEGETABLE FREEZING

ANNIS, in (CP)—"A home building goes a long way" in preparing vegetables for freezing, says H. H. Packer, horticulturist at Nova Scotia college.

Scalding, he explains, is simply a method of pre-cooking vegetables for the freezer. All vegetables to be scalded in either boiling water steam before they are frozen.

Big bags of beans can be scalded in the pot for four minutes, washed, drained and then frozen. They will easily hold the further scalding in necessary. Lima beans also may be scalded four minutes in the pot, washed, drained and then packed for freezing.

Shredded green peppers require ten minutes scalding, chopped peppers for scalding with corn and other foods need only a one-minute scald. They should be frozen one-half inch thick require three minutes.
