OTTAWA (CP)-Canada's post-war course and the measures necessary to carry the Dombiton through the transition from a wartime to a peacetime economy are expected to furnish the principal, topics upon which the June 11th federal general election will be

In saying he welcomed Prime Min-Ister Markensie King's announcement on the election date, M J. Coldwell, C.C.F. leader, remarked that even greater problems than that which the Liberal administration has had to face will confront whatever government is formed after the election.

After the appeal to the people, said Gordon Graydon, Progressive Conservative house leader, his party will be tready and willing and prepared to form the next government of Can-John Blackmore, Social Credit house leader, said his party loo, was ready for the election, but expressed regret parliament had not had time to dehate many important matters

Mr King's announcement of the date of the election took many political observers by surprise Most of them expected it would be held later than June 11th, and some had speculated the date would be advanced at least until early in July. The fact the date chosen coincided with that of the Ontario general election also occasioned some surprise since it had been expected some time would elapse between the Ontario and Dominion molls

For part of the election campaign Mr King will be away from Canada, attending the San Francisco conference on world security and Mr Coldwell and Mr. Graydon also will be

Germans May Make Their Capital in Oberealsberg, Nuernberg or Munich Noted Correspondent Says


