Elected to Legislature, 1943. Farmer and former school teacher. Born in Wilberforce Twp., Victoria World War I. Fifteen years as councillor and re-elected twice.

Contractor, lumberman and farmer. Has long experience in road and railroad construction. Sawmill operator and has large scale lumber interests. Present reeve of Renfrew.

Rich manufacturer. Born in Park. Student in member of Ottawa & Hull Citizens Rehabilitation Committee, and Ottawa St. Lawrence Industrial Accident Prevention Assn.

Provincial Treasurer. Elected to Legislature 1937, re-elected 1943. Born in Oshawa, graduate University of Toronto, 1918. Elected to last war.

Physician. Born at Elgin. Leads Co. Graduate Queen's University in Medicine and Art. Served 7 years on city council. Member 7/24 Field Ambulance, Reserve.



WATERLOO SOUTH
Gordon Chaplin, Waterloo South
President of Canadian General Rubber Co. Ltd., Galt. This company engaged in full war production. Born and educated in St. Catharines, son of late Hon. J. D. Chaplin.



WELLAND

Contractor. Served 7 consecutive years as alderman, and six years as Mayor of Welland. Hon. member Canadian Legion, Chairman Reconstruction Centre Committee.


WINDSOR-WALKERVILLE


YORK NORTH


YORK WEST


YORK BELLWOODS


YORK BRIMLEY


YORK DOVERCOURT


YORK EGLINTON


YORK HIGH PARK

Premier of Ontario. Brilliant overseas soldier in last war. As Minister of Education assumed 30% overall costs education. Has fulfilled all his promises.




YORK PARKDALE


YORK RIVERDALE

Dentist. Served overseas last war with C.A.D.C. Member Board of Education. Mayor of Toronto 4 years. President, Danforth Business Men's Association.




YORK ST. ANDREW'S


YORK ST. DAVID'S
