Juju Magic Real To These Aussies

The Cavalry Commandos in New Guinea tell Queer Stories of Evil Bone

CANBERRA (CP) — There is a little bunch of Australian cavalry commando boys in New Guinea with de-finite ideas about native jujuism.

It began down in the Torricells when they had been working for a fortnight under harassing conditions, getting their messages through a terrible battering of atmospheres and living very hard.

One evil day, a wireless operator brought home a curious bone made from a human skin and shaped like a dagger with a knobby handle on top. "Perhaps there's nothing to it. But the boys, as level-headed a bunch of fighters as you would find, swear that it must have been a juju. It is not just a story, they tell you."

RECOGNIZING GOD'S PRESENCE

Golden Text — The Lord is nigh unto all them that call upon him To all that call upon him in truth Ps. 145: 18.

Lesson Text Gen. 28: 10-22

Time 1760 B.C.

Place Bethel

Exposition I. Jehovah Appears Unto Jacob, 10-15.

The first verse of the lesson shows us Jacob leaving Beer-sheba with its hollowed memories and associations going to distant Haran to meet deception and injustice. It was his own deceit and injustice toward his brother that necessitated this unhappy removal. His deceit did not pay off ch. 29, 23, 25, 31, 7, 37, 32, Gal. 6: 7. Jacob's deception was wholly unjustifiable. God had promised him what he sought to obtain for himself by unscrupulous means ch. 25, 23. Jacob was a nobody ch. 25, 23 but it must have been an especial sorrow for him to be forced away from home. In his loneliness and distress his thoughts had turned toward God ch. 31: 10. An awful loneliness came over Jacob as the sun went down at the close of the first day and darkness swiftly spread over the earth. The place was a desolate lonely one with its high cliff tower before him. That it was a place of God's own selection appears from the Hebrew, which reads, "He lighted upon the place." It was the hour of Jacob's deepest trial up to that time, and it is just such a time that God chooses to reveal Himself and His children ch. 35: 10.

Jacob had only a stone for a pillow but a stone pillow with God men is better than a pillow of down with God far away. Jacob was soon asleep from weariness and sorrow but his shoulders were soon interrupted by strange dreams. Undoubtedly this dream came from God. In his dream Jacob saw a ladder reaching from earth to heaven, with the angels of God ascending and descending upon it. This was a symbol of the close connection between heaven and earth and of the communion going on between the two. Jesus Himself is the true "ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reaching to heaven," or means of heavenly communication between a holy God and sinful man ch. 1: 51, Jno. 11: 6, Heb. 10: 19, 20. In Jacob's dream the angels were the means of communication between God and the earth of Heb. 1: 14, Luke 15: 10, Ps. 91: 11.

Though Jacob's dream was God given and supernatural it had a natural starting point. As he fell asleep the cliffs before his eyes looked like a ladder from earth to heaven. This dream must have been especially comforting to Jacob at this point in his life, when he had so much reason to fear that heaven was shut

against him by his sin. Jacob saw something better than angels, he saw Jehovah Himself standing at the top of the ladder (cf. ch. 35: 9). Jehovah's introduction of Himself was most comforting, it was as the God who had protected and blessed his grandfather and father, a tried and faithful family friend. Jehovah made nine great promises to Jacob: (1) "The land wherein thou liest to thee will I give" ch. 13: 15; (2) "And to thy children of whom Jacob had none as yet" (3) "Thy seed shall be as the dust of the earth" of Gen. 13: 16; (4) "Thou shalt spread abroad, etc." How wonderfully this promise has been fulfilled. Where is the corner of the earth where Israel is not found? (5) "In thee and in thy seed shall all the families of the earth be blessed" ch. 12: 3. A stupendous promise having its fullest fulfillment in Jesus Christ, who was the seed of Jacob (Gal. 3: 16, 18). "I am with thee" Matt. 28: 20. It was particularly fulfilling in that He was so absolutely alone ch. 13: "I will keep thee whatsoever thou goest." What a comfort for one going out he knew not whether ch. 14: 12, 13, 14, 1 Pet. 1: 1, Jno. 10: 28, 29. (6) "I will bring thee again into thy land" of ch. 35: 10. This promise is yet to have a more wonderful fulfillment in the restoration of Israel ch. 10: "I will not leave thee, etc." This was immediately fulfilled in the individual Jacob, it is being marvelously fulfilled through the centuries in the national Israel and is fulfilled day by day in the spiritual Israel ch. 11: 50.

(7) Jacob Vows & Vow Unto Jehovah, 16-22. Jacob as he awakened was afraid. A strange effect for such a cheering dream. But Jacob like us was a sinner. If Jacob had known God was there he would not have stopped there vs. 16, 17. Such is a man's folly. Jacob thought it a "miserable place because God was there, but the presence of God makes a joyful and a dreadful place" vs. 16, 17. But Jacob lay down and seemingly went to sleep again. He was pretty dull spiritually as yet. In the morning he set up his stone pillow as a memorial pillar and set it apart for God by anointing with oil (Ex. 28: 10-12). The incident had a beneficial effect upon Jacob, he "vowed a vow." But it did not entirely overcome his bargaining disposition vs. 20, 21. In fact got all he asked such is God's condescension ch. 32: 10, 11, 4, 18, R.V.

To the writer of this letter and several thousand others who are in the same position, your Hydro can definitely say that your application for service certainly has not "slipped our mind." Everything that can be done is being done to serve as many new customers as soon as possible.

Even though many regulations have been relaxed, and the war in Europe is over, there is little, if any, sign of improvement in the shortage of labour and materials. The shortage of only one of the many parts needed to complete a service results in a delay. The labour and materials available are being used with extreme care and planning to serve as many new rural customers as quickly as possible.

To those applicants in areas where Hydro lines are still to be constructed, Hydro service will be made available as the supply of labour and materials improves. Already sufficient applications have been received which will require the construction of over 2,000 miles of line that cannot be undertaken in 1945. However, your Hydro is making every effort to complete by the end of 1945 all applications made in 1944 that have been officially approved by letter.

Your Hydro has done and is doing everything possible to extend electricity to essential rural services. The Hydro rural service that you are waiting for will be completed just as soon as the labour and material situation permits.
