Canadian Farmers First to get DDT For Insect Control

Several proprietary barn sprays containing the new insecticide popularly known as DDT have been registered recently for sale in Canada under the Pest Control Products Act...

Until recently DDT was restricted almost entirely to military use in controlling lice, mosquitoes, flies and other disease carrying insects in combat areas.

The Department explains that the DDT barn or stable spray is a residual spray and should not be sprayed into the air as is an ordinary fly spray, but should be applied to walls, ceilings and other surfaces frequented by flies and other insects...

The Department says that DDT spray must not be applied to live stock as the chemical is a poison and in oil solution is absorbed through the skin.

The DDT barn sprays have been prepared specially for use in farm buildings such as cattle barns, horse stables and pigsties, and are not intended for household use, says the Department.

A NATION GOD USED

Golden Text: He hath given food unto them that fear him: He will ever be mindful of his covenant. (Ps. 111: 5)

Time: 1715 B.C. Place: Egypt. Exposition: I. Joseph Honored, 45-49.

The life of Joseph is a revelation of the overruling grace of God. He was sold into slavery by his brethren but God turned it to the world's good. He was falsely accused while engaged in his duties as Potiphar's faithful servant and cast into prison but the Lord was with him there and caused all he did to prosper.

Pharaoh called Joseph's name Zaphnathpaneah, which is a Coptic title meaning "a revealer of secrets." One of the Church Fathers, Jerome, says that this name signifies "the Saviour of the World." Both meanings would apply, for under God's providence, Joseph proved to be God's means of revelation and at the same time his economic program did save the then known world from starvation.

At 30 years of age, Joseph stood before Pharaoh, a singular honor in that autocratic court. Armed with legal authority he set up the granaries in which were stored the surpluses of seven years. Here is a good example of the worth of a man of God to human society.

Two sons are born to Joseph. It is in the names he gives them that we are given an insight into the character of the man. The first born is called Manasseh, which means "forgetting." God had enabled Joseph to forget the things which were behind him.

When the second son is born to Joseph he is given the name Ephraim which means "fruitful." God had made Joseph to be fruitful in the land of his affliction. Some years have elapsed. Joseph is at work in his God-given task. All about him are evidences of a new life and prosperity.

The sorrowful past is remote now. He is so busy in his fruit-bearing for Jehovah and a world soon to be imperilled that new hopes fill his mind. As he looks at his little son Ephraim, he thinks also of the great goodness of Jehovah. Is not that what the grace of God is for? How can church members be as indifferent to the needs of many of their own people as this will not be the case of those who are fruit-bearing.

Joseph was an extraordinary man because he had prevision of a coming calamity. Because he lived close to God, he knew the famine was coming. Outside of this faith, it could not have been expected. Who can predict what the immediate years ahead will bring forth? By revealing the coming tragedy to Pharaoh in a dream, and Pharaoh being an absolute monarch, once the king was convinced there could be no public criticism or opposition.

Feed-Bag Fashions For Filipino Gal

Garments, Towels, Sheets Made From Cotton Bags

NEW YORK (CP) - YWCA staff workers in the Philippines will soon "put on the feed-bag," but literally. Two thousand chicken bags are being shipped to the headquarters in Manila, to be made into garments to clothe board and staff members.

The bags come in attractively colored prints as well as plain white. It is expected the printed bags will be used for dresses, the plain one for towels, sheets and tablecloths.

The urgency of the need for clothes in Manila was revealed by Mrs. Flora Hagan, president of the Manila Board of the YWCA, who wrote that the Filipino staff workers were literally in rags, and that 2,500 yards of cotton cloth was needed at once.

Since the National Board could not buy such a quantity of cotton fabric, because of the current cotton shortage, the feed-bags were obtained from chicken raisers in Delaware.
