"CHOSEN FROZEN" STATIONED IN GERMAN MARINE BARRACKS. The following description of the camp of the third division of the Canadian Army Occupation Force was received from Capt. Johnny Gray...

The boys are housed in a notably fine group of brick buildings equipped with every convenience the original designers could think for the comfort of the German naval cadets...

The central block is named "Dominion" and was formerly the mess hall for the entire camp of 4,000 men.

The kitchens are well equipped, fittings include ten-steam-pressure cookers, each five feet in diameter, five electric frying pans, each three feet in diameter and mounted on supports so as to be tipped automatically since no one cook could lift one, four water boilers, each as big as the steam cookers, six electric bake ovens, and a miscellaneous array of meat grinders, coffee grinders, etc., all of giant proportions.
