Hello Homemakers! The need to conserve butter and vegetable fats in cooking has resulted in the more extensive use of fat which has been rendered and clarified at home.

Salvaged fat can be used successfully for frying liver, fish, potatoes, onions or green tomatoes; and for greasing baking pans.

Fatty pieces of raw meat should be rendered in a double boiler.

To clarify fat: (1) A surprising amount of the meat flavor can be removed by placing a potato in the fat and heating until the potato is browned.

In straining fat, we substitute a paper napkin in a sieve for the usual cheesecloth.

Dripping from spiced meats such as flavored sausages should be separated from dripping yielded by mild-flavored meats.

When fat becomes dark and strongly flavored, after it has been used many times for frying, it is no longer good to cook with.

ECONOMICAL GINGERBREAD: 1/2 cup baking fat, 1 egg, 2 1/2 cups sifted flour, 3/4 cup milk, 1 tsp. cinnamon, 2 1/2 cups sugar, 1 cup black molasses, 1 tsp. soda, 1 tsp. ginger, 1 cup boiling water.

CREAM SHORTENING: Cream shortening, add sugar, and cream well. Blend in beaten egg and molasses.

POPKIN CUSTARD: 3 tbsps brown sugar, 3 tbsps corn starch, 3 tsp. cinnamon, 2 eggs (slightly beaten), 1 1/2 cups scalded milk, 1/2 cup cooked pumpkin.

TAKE A TIP: 1. Three lbs. raw pumpkin or 1 1/2 quarts diced pumpkin yields 3 cups mashed cooked pumpkin.

THE SUGGESTION BOX: Miss G. G. suggests: Recipe for home-made soap: 1 cup fat, 1/2 cup water, 2 1/2 tbsps. concentrated lye, 1 tbsps. household ammonia, 1 tsp. borax.

The Sunday School Lesson

THE FRUITS OF PUBLIC WORSHIP

Golden Text: Praise ye Jehovah. I will give thanks unto the Lord with my whole heart.

Lesson Text: Isa. 6: 1-8; Eph. 5: 15-21

Exposition: Isaiah's Vision of Jehovah of His Majesty, Ch. 6: 1-8

This passage contains the record of Isaiah's call to special service. He may have prophesied before this (cf. 1: 1), but from this time his ministry took on a new form and power.

Verse 3 contains the central truth about the Lord whom Isaiah saw. He is holy, that is the fundamental truth about God in the Old Testament.

The Seraphim, literally "burning ones," burning in their own holiness, were so overpowered by the sense of the holiness of Him in whose presence they stood that with two wings they covered their faces.

The third step was cleansing from sin. To God can make the vilest clean. It is only when he has more than we are fit for in his hands that he is cleansing by fire and blood.

The last step was a call from God and the quick and hearty response.

ALLIES KNEW NAZIS PLANNED RUZZ BOMB

WASHINGTON (CP) - The Allies had a tip-off that the Germans were preparing to launch robot bombs at least six months before the first buzzer was aimed against London and a defence was planned.

This information is contained in a scientific report dealing with the development of the V1 or proximity fuse for anti-aircraft shells and other missiles.

The plan included the use of anti-aircraft fire. Since movies had previously demonstrated the effectiveness of the V1 in anti-aircraft fire, the fuse was included in the preparations.

The first buzz bomb was launched against London in June, 1944, but 3 months prior to that time shells containing the fuses were issued to 80 millimeter anti-aircraft batteries in England in preparation for the attack.

The fuses saw only limited use in the early stages of the attack, a new report says because of "various limitations to anti-aircraft firing of the safety of civilian population."

But then use was gradually stepped up, working in conjunction with improved radar and improved gun-direction, finally, as a report from an army observer declares.

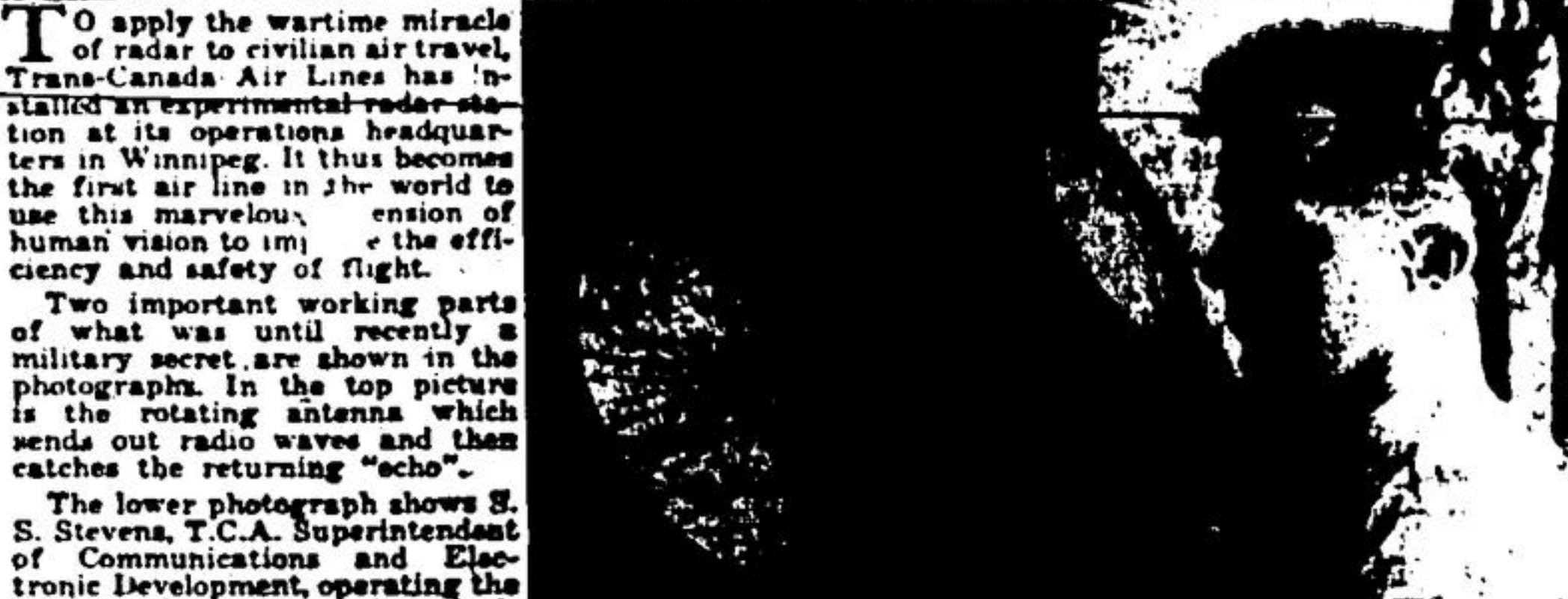
NEW BREEDS SHEEP: A visit to a fair where a large number of the multitude of English breeds of sheep are displayed would lead one to think that there were already too many breeds.
