# T.C.A. FIRST AIR LINE TO USE RADAR'S "MAGIC EYE"



O apply the wartime miracle of radar to civilian air travel. Trans-Canada Air Lines has 'nstalled an experimental radar station at its operations headquarters in Winnipeg. It thus becomes the first air line in the world to use this marvelou, ension of human vision to imi e the efficiency and safety of flight.

Two important working parts of what was until recently a military secret are shown in the photographs. In the top picture is the rotating antenna which sends out radio waves and them catches the returning "echo".

The lower photograph shows S. S. Stevens, T.C.A. Superintendent of Communications and Electronic Development, operating the "Cathode Ray Indicator", radar's screen, which is similar to that used in television.
