Further Extensions For Water Service Arranged This Year

New Section at East of Crescent Will Have Service Under Mutual Agreement

A special meeting of Acton Council and Public Utilities Commission was held Monday evening at the home of Reeve J. M. McDonald with all members of both organizations present.

The meeting was called to consider extending water mains in the new subdivision being opened by Beardmore and Co. at the end of Guelph Street.

As the Council's funds for the year are expended Beardmore and Co. offered to install this six-inch main and the Corporation will pay for it next year. The Company also proposed that they install mains in that part of the subdivision that lies in the Township of Esquesing. The mains in the Township are to be paid for by Beardmore and Co. and if within the next five years this section is taken into the municipality of the Village of Acton it is to them pay the cost of laying these mains.

A charge of 10 per cent over the rate paid by the consumers of Acton is to be paid by the residents of Esquesing for water service and \$75 per year for the use of a fire hydrant to be installed outside the Corporation. Installation and hydrant to be paid by Beardmore and Co.

Council upon motion authorized the Reeve and Clerk to make the necessary agreement with Beardmore and Co. and to sign the documents required.
