Milk Camouflage Brings Protests

Churchmen Oppose Glamorizing Reverage as "Milk Cocktail" in School "Bars"

WINNIPEG (CP) Disapproval of the proposed idea . to encourage school children to drink more milk by establishing milk bars has been voiced by the Winnipeg Presbytery of the United Church of Canada which passed a resolution to send a letter to Dr. F. W. Jackson, Manitoba's deputy minister of health

The idea was advanced in the Manitoba Nutritional Notes, published by the province's department of health, and inserted in the larger publication Canadian Nutritional Notes. A paragraph said the schools could increase milk distribution by dressing up tables fike bars and advertising "milk cocktails."

While the presbytery appreciated the efforts of the health department to increase milk drinking it thought the "mitk bar" approach a regrettable ides and recommended that a more suitable educational method be used, the resolution said.

This is not the first time that the question of milk drinking in the schools has come up. The Canadian Institute for the Blind at one time operated milk canteens. Then somebody objected to the word canteen

BIRDS ARE VICTIMS OF WAR

The accidental introduction of rate into Midway Island in the liawagan Group during the disturbed conditions of wartime has resulted in the total extinction of two unique species of birds now on display in the Royal Ontario Museum. The Laysan Rail and the Layson Finch were natives originally of Laysan Island, also one of the Hawalian Group, but were exterminated there when rabbits were admitted to the island early in the twentieth century. The rabbits virtually destroyed all of the vegetation of the island and with it the birds' food supply of seeds and insects Before their extermination on Laysan, - however, both species had been introduced on Midway Island and at first had flourished there. Since the rail was flightless and both species nested on or near the ground, they were unable to survive the depredations of the rat.
