OFFICIALS BURN FORGED CURRENCY

LONDON (Reuters) — Large quantities of fraudulent Bank of England notes which the Germans forged as part of a campaign to disrupt Britain's economy have been destroyed under supervision of bank officials. The notes of 10 shillings (\$2.25) and one pound (\$1.50) and five pound denominations, were recovered on the continent. The five pound notes were said to be particularly clever forgeries.
