

What for Building?

"What for Building" is the subject of an interesting article in a recent issue of Maclean's Magazine by John Coulfield Smith. In this, he deals with the new building materials and methods.

Among the features mentioned is a new use of concrete where the walls are poured into forms and then raised into position. In Ottawa an all-steel prefabricated house has been built. It is a bungalow that this house in mass production would cost about the same as a frame house of similar size. Steel joists have been used in home construction and steel sash have been used but the average cost is high.

Aluminum is being used for a certain type of house in Montreal. These are being made at the rate of sixty a day, but the cost is much higher than for wood construction. In this prefabricated house the metal is used as a sheath enclosing a frame house.

Aluminum and steel roofing is being made in the USA but not in Canada. The former costs about twice the latter in asbestos covering with steel roof. The steel roof is given an enamel finish which washes away and is replaced.

Canada supplies most of the metal for the 10,000 aluminum houses being built in Britain.

OTTAWA (CP) - The second session of Canada's 29th Parliament, which finally concluded after a gruelling period of long sittings, might well be known in history as the "Restless Session."

The affairs of a country in its first full year of peace after six years of war kept the members occupied for more than five months with matters of international, national and local character.

Members set to work March 11 and during their sitting, the 11th session became a record through a series of strikes for higher wages in the lumber, shipping, rubber, steel and other industries, through demands for higher returns for farmers, and through requests for the removal of wartime price and other controls.

Some of the more important events of the session were still evident at press time. The steel strike, to which members sought a resolution during the session, was still in progress, and no settlement was in sight.

THE THREE R's FOR BIRDS AND MAMMALS

Imagine this! Although it's September there will be no school, no reading, writing and arithmetic, no need for books and pencils in the bird world that is! According to bird authorities of the Royal Ontario Museum, young birds acquire their essential knowledge readily made. Though bird youth may learn a bit through experience by error and trial, the equipment for successful living largely comes via their ancestors, through hand-down inheritance. Most of their habits and behaviour are prompted by instinct. If we could do algebra instinctively, school days surely would be brighter.

Many young mammals, however, go through a kind of schooling. Some born in late winter or in spring have finished a training period by September and are ready to graduate. They cannot "repeat the year"; if they fail they die by the swift pounce of the predator the gun of the hunter, from hunger or accident. Some of the teaching is by the parent, some comes in play, and some by the rough school of experience. Young wolves may stay in the family pack "under instruction" for a year or more. Black bear seldom has more than two young, and can spend a good deal of time slapping her cubs into good behaviour.
