SALMON SPEARING ABOUT 1890

In Paul Kane's vivid painting 'Salmon by Torlight' which hangs in the Royal Ontario Museum, the artist portrays an early fishing scene at York which he described in his book 'Wanderings of an Artist among the Indians of North America'.

'We saw some Indians spearing salmon by night this has a very picturesque appearance. The strong red glare of the flaming pine knots, and the iron frame or light, at the bow of the canoe, throwing the naked figures of the Indians in wild relief upon the dark water and sombre woods. As the light is intense and being above the head of the fisherman, it enables him to see the fish distinctly at a great depth and at the same time it apparently either dazzles or attracts the fish. I have seen as many as 100 light-jacks gliding about the Bay of Toronto, and have joined in the sport.'
