Okanagan Valley Towns Flourish

Property Values Soar, Population Jumps in Fruit-Growing

KELOWNA, B. C. (CP) — A new era of prosperity is dawning in the Okanagan Valley, Canada's fruit-growing centre in the West.

This expansion, unlike a mining boom which is based upon extraction of irreplaceable commodities, is based upon annually recurring crops, increasing year by year as orchards come into maturity.

Two years ago, one Kelowna business man bought a four-acre orchard for \$6,000. This season's crop returned \$14,000.

Another resident bought an orchard for \$5,000 five years ago. He has just taken off a crop worth \$40,000.

Throughout the valley, populations are increasing daily. Three towns, Vernon, Kelowna and Penticton, have doubled their populations since the last federal census of 1941.

Housing is becoming more difficult than in some of the larger coast cities. Major Gen. F. Worthington was in Vernon recently to arrange for the use of military camp buildings to ease the crowding.

President A. W. Howlett of the Vernon Board of Trade has just announced plans for the construction of a 75-room hotel to take up the overflow from other hotels.

At Kelowna, the federal government is constructing an income tax building to handle the tax collection for the entire southern British Columbia interior.

A Chicago food products firm recently purchased five acres near Vernon for the erection of their major Western Ontario packing plant.

AMHERST, N.S. (CP) — Fines totalling \$2,400 have been imposed on 4 Cumberland county men convicted of selling horse meat to Halifax packing companies as boneless beef at prices above the six-cents-a-pound ceiling for horse meat.

PAUL'S MISSION IN ASIA MINOR

Golden Text: It was the good pleasure of God to reveal his Son in me, that I might preach him among the Gentiles. (Gal. 1: 15-16)

Lesson Text: (Ac. 13: 1-5, 13-14, 44-46, 48-49, 14: 26-27)

Exposition: I Barnabas and Saul called by the Holy Spirit, Ac. 13: 1-5. The church at Antioch had five prophets and teachers, worthy of mention by name.

It was prayer to which men gave themselves so heartily that they withdrew themselves even from their necessary food to pursue it.

Missionary work was too hard for John Mark, but the day came when Mark did better (ch. 15: 38, 39; Col. 4: 10; 2 Tim. 4: 11).

Opposition did not frighten Paul and Barnabas. It made them the more bold. The Word of God, according to God's order, must "first be spoken" unto the Jew (v. 26; Luke 24: 47; Ac. 13: 26, 18: 5, 6; Rom. 1: 16).

THE GENTILES glorified the Word of God that the Jews despised. The practical evidence that anyone is ordained to eternal life is that he believes (v. 48; Jno. 6: 37). The others, who did not believe, could have believed if they would (Jno. 7: 17; Rev. 23: 17; Jno. 5: 40).

THE LORD made great progress (ch. 6: 7; 19: 20, 26). This awakened fierce opposition and bitter persecution. Notable success of the Gospel always does. The devil will not allow the Gospel to triumph without a mighty fight (ch. 4: 1-3; 5: 14-18; 6: 8-14).

Model Trainmen From 18 to 70

Operate Miniature Railroad in Basement of Ottawa House

OTTAWA (CP) — Men will be boys! And just to prove that meet some of the members of the Ottawa Association of Model Trainmen, which operates the Grand Central Railroad of Canada.

The dozen or so members, ranging in age from 18 to 70, meet once a week in F. Fentimans basement to work on their railroad, which is complete with locomotives, freight cars, stations, electric switches and 4 1/2 feet of track.

Everything is in perfect scale, one-quarter inch to the foot. The four locomotives are replicas of their giant prototypes down to such details as automatic couplings, a whistle that whistles, and the trade name in letters twenty thousands of an inch high on the bell leading caps.

Three station houses, four a copy of Ottawa West Station, automobiles, people waiting for trains and water tanks all are found in the Fentimans cellar. By Christmas a new line will be painted in and a street car loop added. A lake and canal system with three bridges will be installed just Mrs. Fentimans laundry tub. When completed the system will have 1,000 feet of track, almost 300 models.

The value of the railroad has been estimated at \$500 in railway cars, \$275 in locomotives and \$200 in track and wiring.

All work must be done in the post railroad procedure. As Mr. Fentimans said: "There's no fun in just running the thing around — any kid can do that."

When, as has happened occasionally, the "engineer" goes to sleep, and there's a head-on collision, the scattered cars aren't just placed back on the track. No, sir, they're hoisted back on with a miniature wrecking crane a good four or five hours work.
