The Sunday School Lesson

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 3rd

THE BASIS OF CHRISTIAN FREEDOM

Golden Text: We believe that we shall be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus. Ac 15: 11.

Lesson Text: Ac 15: 23b-29, Gal 5: 13, 18.

Exposition 1. The decision of the Holy Spirit and the Apostles, Ac 15: 23b-29.

The great controversy in the early Church was whether a man is saved upon faith apart from the works of the law, or whether man is saved upon faith and works of the law. This is the great battle Paul fought, and in a later day Martin Luther. Three arguments were brought forward at the Council in Jerusalem to refute the Judaizers...

These arguments convinced the Council and the Mosiac law was not laid upon the Gentile Church. The apostles and elders and the whole Church took precautions to guard against any misrepresentation of their decision being taken back to Antioch by the legalizers...

Many American Christians have not yet reached the point where they regard every converted Chinese or African as a brother. The description of the Judaizers is very striking and suggestive. "Certain which went out from us have troubled you with words. This kind of troublemakers are not all dead yet. They creep in unawares and whisper specious false words to young converts. There is no way in which the devil can more trouble believers, and especially converts, or more thoroughly unsettle (subvert) their souls, than by false words. These false words must be met by the word of truth (Col 4: 6) and above all, by the Word of God (2 Tim 3: 13-15). The apostles emphatically denied all responsibility (v. 24) for this pernicious teaching, that men must keep the law of Moses in order to be saved (v. 1).

They had come to absolute unanimity about the matter in question. It is a great thing when brethren who differ can meet together under the Holy Spirit's guidance as did these early Christians, and thus "come to one accord." There is no need of any differences on essential points among those who bow to the authority of the Bible and are honestly asking wisdom of God (1 Jn 1: 5-7). The apostles and the whole church bestowed very lofty praise on Paul and Barnabas. It was well deserved (2 Cor 11: 23-27).

Of how many disciples-to-day could it be justly said that they had hazarded their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ? Anyone who desired to be a disciple of Christ must be willing to do it (Luke 14: 26). It was not their own decision on this great question that they were sending; it was the Holy Spirit's decision. They were perfectly sure of this (v. 28). It is our privilege to know this (Jno 16: 13; 14: 26; 1 Jn 2: 27). It was because they sought and obtained the mind of the Spirit that they were able to "come to one accord."

If Love, the Best Manifestation of the Christian Life, Gal 5: 13-18. The call of Christ is a call to freedom; perfect freedom (Jno 8: 36; Rom 8: 15; see also preceding context, vs. 1-12), the only real freedom possible to man. But "freedom" may be misunderstood and abused, and thus become "an occasion to the flesh" to lead us into all kinds of lusts and passions and sins, and thus lead us into the most abject and degrading slavery known to man. Paul warns against this misunderstanding and abuse of freedom. True "freedom" is governed not by the lusts of the flesh but by the law of love, and love seeks not its own but makes us "to the servants one to another." Verse 13 would solve all our problems in the industrial world, the commercial world, the political world and in international relations, if we would only live by it. "The whole law" of God as regards man's duty to man is summed up in one word, LOVE. "thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." If all men would obey that law, wars would cease and all other evils would cease.

Paul tells the simple but glorious secret of not fulfilling the lusts of the flesh. The secret is not simply this, "Walk by the Spirit." Our walk is our daily conduct. To "walk by the Spirit" is to give the control of our conduct into the keeping of the Holy Spirit of God (cf. Rom 8: 14). "The Spirit of God dwells within every believer in Christ (1 Cor. 6: 19; Rom.

8: 9), and is ready to take complete control of every act and word and thought. If we will give Him control we will not fulfill the lusts of the flesh. If we do not we certainly shall. The flesh is not natural self, which is largely under the control of our physical natures. The lusts of the flesh are not something overcome once for all by some momentary experience by which we enter into "the higher life," but they are overcome by daily walking by the Spirit.
