New Car Prices Increase -

The WPTB-granted increase of 10 per cent in the consumer price of new Canadian made automobiiles raises the cost of a medium-priced car about \$217, or 16 per cent over what it cost in 1941. In the United States the same model cost \$387 or 37 per cent more than in 1941.

The WPTB order, effective Dec. 18, also permits an increase of 7 per cent, in the price of commercial vehicles.
