Chronicles of. . Ginger Farm

I tried to write this column yesterday but it simply couldn't be done two days of almost continuous rain just about congealed every thought I ever had. Now the sun is shifting and I feel much better-at least I do as long as I stay indoors. A little while ago I went to feed the chickens and in the yard it was like walking on an over-sized slimy, slippory aponge. Why all the chickens don't die in this weather I'll never know. We give them the best of care we can but when they are running in and out in the wet the bedding gets damp

just about as fast as we put it down. And yet we have lost comparatively few. This has been an ideal year for the development of coccidiosis but we have also managed to keep away Britain's pipeline system which dur- from that, mainly, I think, by not ing the war acted as a life line for the feeding the chicks too heavily at any

In fact we have revolutionized our chick feeding methods altogether this year. . The price of commercial feed as every: poultryman knows is entirely out of proportion to what we get for chickens and eggs. So, instead of giving the chicks high cost feed; we give them one feed a day of growing mash, after that the troughs are filled up with a mixture of rolled wheat and oats from our own grain of course -- at night they are fed straight wheat. That has been their menu since they were four or five weeks old. Alp to that time they were fed commercial chick starter. Oh, but I forgot one important item--

they get all the sour skim milk they will drink and that is plenty! We pour it into the troughs -- wooden troughs -along with the rolled grain. What will be the final outcome I don't know. I expect the chicks will mature more slowly -- perhaps the pullets won't lay as early nor the cockerels develop as fast, but at least they won't have eaten up all our profit in

Then there are the calves. It is always a problem to know which is more profitable—to veal the calves or to sell them when they are three or four days old and then sell the milk they would otherwise consume. Generally there are other factors which help decide the issue; If they are helfer calves it is usually customary to raise them. But if they happen It to be first calves then to leave them with their mothers is an easy way to I milk the helfers. That is why we have so many calves running around this-year-just-to-milk-the heifers. We had six beifers freshen just within n few weeks of each other, as well as a few cows, so do you wonder Partner talks about his "nursery"? 
