Recent Graduates Enthuse About Course



Recent graduates of the Nursing Assistants Courses speak enthusiastically about their training and the interesting and remunerative employment they are now following. Under the joint supervision of the Departments of Health and Education training centres at Toronto, Hamilton and Kingston are well equipped for instruction. Students receive \$60 per month and provide their own maintenance. Transportation costs to the Training Centre are paid by the Departments. Free uniforms, including stockings, are provided. The course lasts for nine months, three, of which are given over to classroom instruction with the balance being spent in practical hospital experience. The instructors are experienced Registered Nurses with special qualifications. Upon graduation the student receives a certificate from the Department of Health as a Certified Nursing Assistant, Entrants require Grade 8 education, must be in good health and be between the ages of 18 and 40. The fifth course commences September 2nd. Information and application forms can be obtained from the Director, Division of Nurses Registration, Department of Health, 455 Spadina Avenue, Toronto.
