NOTICE — Re Traffic Regulations in Acton

Extracts from Truffic By-law No. 587 at July 20th, 1928 are published for information and guidance of all persons.

SECTION (8) "No vehicle shall be allowed to remain upon or be driven through any street so as to blockade or obstruct traffic.

SECTION (11). "Vehicles shall not stop on or obstruct crossings.

SECTION (12) No vehicle shall stop so as to obstruct the engrance to any lane or driveway into private garages or into any bulding."

The occupant of any business or property on any street shall be given space for parking on such street if such space is required by him, subject to the regular traffic regulat-MIN

SECTION (13). No horse or vehicle shall be left in such a manner as to obstruct the ordinary traffic of the streets, and no horse or yehicle shall be parked an unreasonable length of time, having regard to the traffic requirements of the street in question."

SECTION (14) "No vehicle shall stand within six feet of a fire hydrant."

SECTION (116) "No vehicle shall stand or park directly opposite another vehicle which is already standing on the other side of the street when such standing or parking will per-. , vent the passage of two lines of traffic."

The foregoing extracts apply in all parts of the village and especially to on Agnes Street, a very narrow street between Frederick and Elgin Streets.
