The Sunday School Lesson. SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 9th.

DISCIPLINED LIVING (Temperance Lesson). Golden Text: Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God. 1 Cor. 10: 31.

Lesson Text: 1 Pet. 1: 13-23; 4: 1-5. Exposition: 1. Redeemed by Christ, 1: 13-23.

We are to study the interpretation of redemption by one whom the Lord redeemed. Peter is a vivid illustration of conversion. The Holy Spirit so enriched his life and understanding that his epistles are full of concentrated truth.

What is a redeemed person (18, 19)? The apostle makes it plain that no earthly wealth purchases redemption. Heaven is not for sale. But we are "redeemed." Here is a precious word meaning to be bought back, restored, repossessed by God.

But we should make clear that it is not the blood of Christ within His veins which is efficacious, but the offering of that blood as a sacrifice for our sins. Just as in the case of the O. T. sacrifices, when it was not until the animal's blood was offered on the altar, so it was the pouring out of the blood of Christ in death on Calvary that wrought our redemption (Jno. 19: 31; Heb. 9: 11, 12).

Faith in God is substantiated (v. 21). Through the redeeming Christ we come to God. Realities found in the Person and work of Jesus inspire both faith and hope. Jesus confirms all faith that rests itself in Him, and He never fails to bring all believers into the presence of God.

One is a Christian to the extent he has the mind of Christ. The Christian manner of feeling and thinking. The mind of Christ was to suffer in the flesh (cf. Phil. 3: 5-8). Christ could have avoided suffering in the flesh, if He had so chosen. In the first place, it was purely voluntary on His part that He ever became flesh; but beyond that, being in the flesh, He could, if He would, have avoided suffering in the flesh. But to have done so would have involved His forsaking the path of obedience to God and love to man. He therefore chose to suffer as suffering in the flesh was a necessary incident of obeying God and serving man. So it is for everyone (2 Tim. 3: 12). Sooner or later the man who obeys God absolutely and lives to the utmost of his power for his fellow-men, must suffer for it in his body somehow. There will always be a conflict when the time of decision comes. To win in that conflict we must arm ourselves.

As one reads verse 3 it becomes increasingly evident that those to whom Peter wrote the lofty exhortations of this epistle had not always been saints, and yet the highest possibilities of Christian living were open to them. Indeed, oftentimes the foulest sinners have become the fairest saints.
