Prairies May Soon Grow Sugar Maples

If the tests being carried out at the Dominion Experimental Station at Morden, Manitoba, to evolve a strain ; of sugar maple suitable for the Prairles are successful, all Canada may become, indeed, the Land of the Maple. The leaf of the sugar maple is Canada's floral national emblem, but unfortunately this valuable tree, esteemed alike for its beauty and utility-its sugar sap and wavy-grained the Frst Day of November, 1947. furniture wood-is a native of only a part of Canada and, while it grows as far south as Georgia, it does not extend far north in Canada. 


