The erect on ice palaces to satisfy the cravings of the present sports mad public has reached an all time high in this district. Hockey hunger is to be satisfied lavishly. Huge demands on the purses of the moguls are receiving enthusiastic response from every quarter. They are investing wisely. This semester, arenas will be packed. The hockey famine is approaching its last ditch defense, after stalking for an untold number of years, boldly and menacingly into burghs such as our own, where the ice game is king while the snow flies.

To our north, south, west and east, feverish activity is going on which includes practically the entire array of cities and towns in central Ontario. Guelph are renovating the Winter Fair building in an extensive program which eventually is hoped to be a replica of Maple Leaf Gardens on a smaller scale. Our nearest neighbor, Georgetown, have nearly completed the installation of artificial ice in their John St. Gardens. Their grandiose scheme is to be finished approximately December 1st. Milton's plans for artificial ice have been postponed until next semester when the County Town's arena, now owned by a private interest, will be remodelled.

A ville such as Brampton, who have been out of the O.H.A. picture for a generation, typifies the present spirit of projection. A \$100,000 scheme to construct among other things an arena, with a view to entering the O.H.A. Intermite is in the negotiation stage and all indications point to a successful conclusion. Already the recreational director for the Flower Town is organizing a system to introduce the ice game to Brampton.

New edifices in Hespler, Waterloo and a mammoth project on paper in Kitchener add to the picture.

### FARM INVESTMENT TOTALS BILLIONS

Capital investment in Canadian farms in 1946 amounted to \$5,922,347,000, more than 38 per cent above the figure recorded by the 1941 census, according to the Quarterly Bulletin of Agricultural Statistics for April-June 1947. The investment includes land and buildings, implements and machinery including motor trucks and automobiles, and livestock, including poultry and animals on fur farms.

The estimated value of farm capital in 1946 was almost seven per cent higher than the value for 1945, but nearly 78 per cent of it can be attributed to the enhanced value of land and buildings. Higher prices for livestock, which more than offset a decrease in numbers, and substantial purchases of farm implements during 1945 increased the value of both these components of farm capital in 1946.

## DDT NOT A REPELLENT

The chemical DDT, though extremely effective in killing many kinds of insects, is not itself a repellent and will not keep away flies, mosquitoes and other pests. Actually this is an advantage as insects are not discouraged from coming into contact with the chemical and receiving a lethal dose. DDT does not kill insect eggs, though solvents used in some sprays containing it may do so, but because of the length of time DDT remains active after application, young larvae or nymphs are likely to be killed when they hatch from the eggs and come in contact with the residue of the chemical.

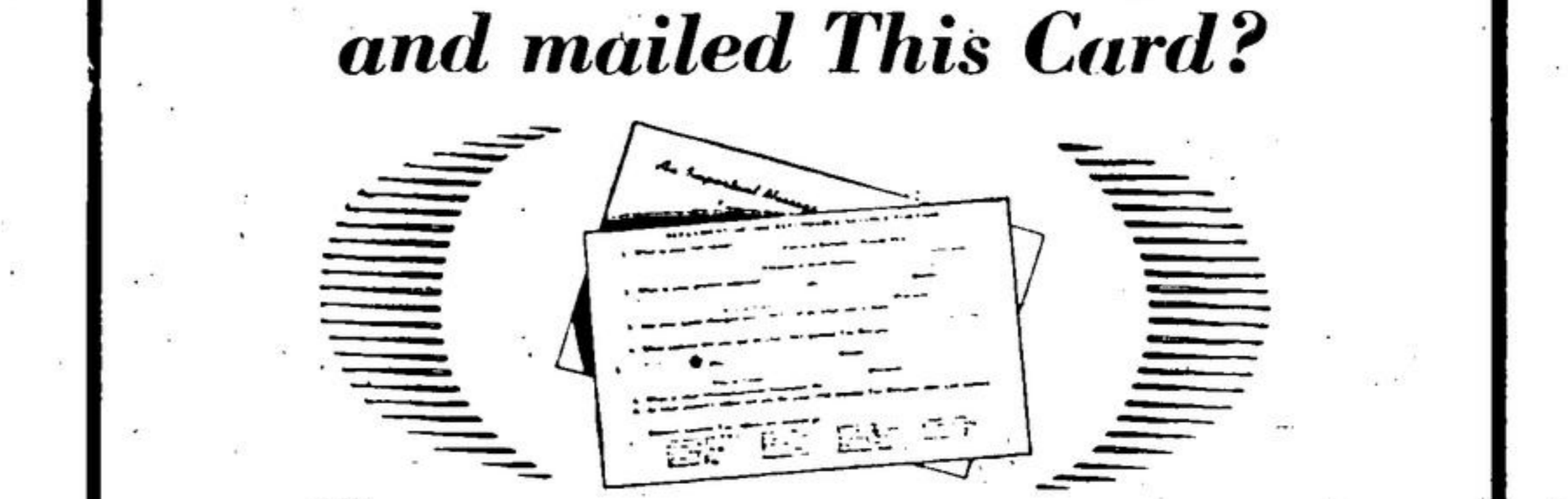
