IMMUNIZATION CLINICS BY HALTON COUNTY HEALTH UNIT

A series of clinics for the immunization of infants and pre-school children in Acton will be held by the Halton County Health Unit in the Town Hall. The first of these clinics will be held on Friday, January 9th beginning at 2:30 p.m.

At these Clinics immunization against small pox, diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus (lock-jaw) will be available.

Immunization should begin as early as possible in a child's life, not only because reactions are less among the younger children but also because the protection, especially against whooping cough, is most vital in the first year of life. For protection against diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus, three injections each 3 to 4 weeks apart are needed. There should be a "booster" or re-inforcing dose one year after the original course of injection and another just before the child commences school. These injections should begin when the child is 3 to 6 months of age. Vaccination against small pox should be done at the same time.

Miss A. Anderson, Public Health Nurse, will be in charge of these clinics and Dr. James H. Mather will carry out the immunization procedures. This is another service being offered by the Halton County Health Unit to the people of Acton. Parents are urged to take advantage of these procedures for the benefit of their children.

PITHEAD SURGERIES FOR COAL MINERS

Surgeries in charge of a State registered nurse working under the supervision of a doctor, are being provided in baths at all the pitheads in Britain. The first of these new colliery medical treatment centres has just been opened by the Minister of Fuel and Power in Durham. The scheme is part of the comprehensive social services for miners which are being provided through the agency of the Miners' Welfare Commission.
