Obituary

GEORGE T. WILSON

Born in Nasagaweya Township and spending his entire life on the homestead at lot 26, concession 4, George T. Wilson passed away on Sunday in his seventy-ninth year. He was a son of the late Thomas and Jane Wilson, pioneers of Nasagaweya Township.

George Wilson was a citizen who took a keen and active interest in the good of his community. He was a member of the Ebenezer United Church, was the secretary of the Church Board, a teacher in the Sunday School and also treasurer during his lifetime. He was interested in municipal affairs and served for years as an election officer. For more years than we can recall he was a correspondent for the Fair Press and most diligent in this community service. He will be missed indeed in the Nasagaweya community and all join in sympathy with the loss sustained.

A family of six sons and two daughters remain to revere his memory. His wife, Eliza Jane King predeceased him sixteen years ago. The family are, Clarence, Mildred, John and Ross at home; Ernest in Milton; Reginald in Acton and Hazel (Mrs. Wm. Morley) Peterborough. A son Cecil was killed in action in 1914 and another son Erwin lost his life in a boating accident in 1927 in Ontario in 1938. Survivors of his family are one sister, Mrs. Wm. Forbes and two brothers, Freeman of Guelph and Bentley, of Acton. Ten grandchildren and two great grandchildren also survive him.

At the funeral service on Tuesday afternoon many friends gathered at the Johnstone & Rumley Funeral Home in tribute to Mr. Wilson. The service was in charge of his minister, Rev. R. W. Pickersgill. Interment was in Ebenezer Cemetery.

Towers Built in Acton Broadcast Across Canada

Most radio listeners in Acton or the district are not aware of the station facilities provided by this industrial centre. If most any citizen were questioned regarding Acton's part in the radio industry the answer would be that Acton has no industry connected with radio. Yet Acton does play quite a part because Ajax Engineers build at their plant here most of the radio towers for the broadcasting stations of Canada.

These towers range in height from 110 feet to 300 feet and stations may have from one to four towers to carry the antenna. This firm is constructing the new tower for the new station at Guelph. Here is a list of towers built for stations across Canada with their height and location.
