Towers Built in Acton Broadcast Across Canada

Most radio listeners in Acton or the district are not aware of the station facilities provided by this industrial centre. If most any citizen were questioned regarding Acton's part in the radio industry the answer would be that Acton has no industry connected with radio. Yet Acton does play quite a part because Ajax Engineers build at their plant here most of the radio towers for the broad-

casting stations of Canada. These towers range in height from 110 feet to 300 feet and stations may have from one to four towers to carry the antenna. 
