F. W. JOHNSON

A resident of Georgetown since last summer, F. William Johnson died suddenly at his home here on Saturday May 18th. Mr. Johnson had moved here from Halifax after his retirement as maritime manager of the Northern Electric Co., purchasing William McNally's house on Edith Street.

Born in England 70 years ago, he has been a member of the Northern Electric organization for 37 years, first serving with the firm in Montreal, Calgary and Toronto. Enlisting from Toronto with the 180 Sportsman's Battalion, he served overseas as a field paymaster in the first Great War. After the war he was in publicity work with the firm in Montreal before going to Halifax. He was prominent in Halifax community life and was a past president of Halifax Rotary Club, past president of the Nova Scotia Kennel Club, member of St. Andrew's Masonic Lodge, honorary member of the supreme council of the A.N. and A.S.R. and life member of the Telephone Pioneers of America (Acadian Chapter). He was president of the Halifax Curling Club during the war. He was a member of the Georgetown United Church.

Mr. Johnson is survived by his wife, the former Ena Pearson of Acton, one daughter, Norma, wife of Wing Cmdr. W. H. Stapley of Ottawa, and a granddaughter Pamela.

Funeral services were held on Monday from the McTutor Funeral Home with interment being made in Greenwood Cemetery Georgetown. Pall-bearers were James Evans, James Goodlet, E. J. Hunsard of Acton, Sam Mackenzie, Maxwell Moore of Ballinacraig and E. H. Swaghamer Georgetown Herald.

STILL SHORT

Serious shortages of oils and fats to meet world requirements are likely to continue through 1948, and indeed for some years to come. In 1947 exports of oils and fats were only about 3 million metric tons against pre-war exports of 5 million metric tons. Exports from all principal producing countries, with the exception of North America and the Philippines, were less than pre-war, the most serious declines being in Manchuria and India.

Though exports in 1948 are estimated at 3.9 million metric tons, it still leaves a serious gap between world supplies and world requirements. The countries which will suffer most from this scarcity are naturally those which normally import heavily and those whose domestic production has declined drastically.
