EDEN MILLS

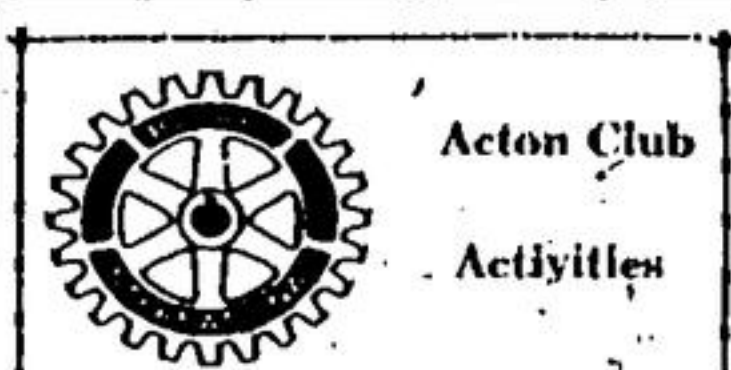

THE RECORD:
 EDUCATION—Grants increase 1943—\$8,300,000, 1948—\$33,200,000. Better facilities fair salaries, lighter tax to real estate.
 HEALTH—Grants increased, 1943—\$10,750,000, 1948—\$22,000,000.
 WELFARE—Pensions and Allowances, a figure never thought of by previous governments.
 HYDRO—Rates equalized, reduced. All available equipment used for extension, 87,000 additional farms by end of year.
 AGRICULTURE—Farmers advise Government, to receive more consideration and assistance.
 HIGHWAYS—More money spent on Highways, new grants to villages, towns, cities, grants for bridges 80 per cent. (in part only 50).
 FINANCE—Everything paid for, \$25,000,000 paid off debt in one year.

 AGRICULTURE—Continued policy of listening to farm organizations, expand research and experimentation, increase grants under Community Hall Act.
 HEALTH—Continued expansion of health services.

 HYDRO—Complete rural extension program, double millions of new horsepower. Standardized cycle.
 TOURIST INDUSTRY—Expanded, bringing new money.
 HIGHWAYS—Greatest highway building program in history of Province.
