Council Holds June Meeting in the New Council Chambers at Stewarttown

The regular meeting of Esqueping Township Council was held Tuesday afternoon. Deputy-Reeve George Currie, Councilors, George Lealle, H. Craig Reid and Wilfred Bird were present. Reeve, George E. Cleave presided.

Approval of Township Road Expenditure By-Law 1948, for \$50,000.00 was resolved in accordance with the Highway Improvement Act.

Accounts were passed for payment as follows: Bell Telephone, services \$478; Province of Saskatchewan, charity, \$20.00; Dept. of Public Welfare, re relief, less Mother's Allowance credit, \$486.76; A. W. Benton, supplies \$11.00; Jas. Russell, ewe killed \$28.00; Spencer Wilson valuator, \$4.00; G. Ray McEnergy, lamb killed, \$7.00; F. W. Shorthill, valuator, \$4.00; T. Harding Price, 5 lambs killed \$50.00; K. C. Lindsay, sheep killed \$25.00; A. N. Stark, valuator, \$12.00; Hawes and Nelson on hall account, less credit, 253.70; on garage account \$61.40.

Relief accounts of \$24.10 and road accounts of \$1,585.08 were also passed.

F. C. Olliff was paid \$170 for modified water system in the Township Hall and Ted Bluid \$400 on painting contract.

Council accepted the tender of Wm. R. Dick and Douglas Shearman for a bridge between the 6th and 7th concession. And the tender of Georgetown Motors for a one-ton truck.

The Reeve was authorized to sign a warrant for tax sale.

Annual Inspection of Roads in Erin Given to Council

The Erin Township Council met on June 2 in Hilsburgh. Members were all present and Reeve Goldwin Burt presided.

The Road and Bridge Committee accompanied by the Road Superintendent made their annual inspection of the roads and bridges in the Township on Monday, May 17th and reported the roads in fair condition and recommended that several portions of roads be graded and gravelled during 1948.

The committee report was received and adopted, the members were paid for their services and Councillor Wallace received \$5.00 for use of car.

The Insurance Policy covering Road Liability with the Lloyd's Insurance Co. of London, England, was renewed and the premium of 200.24 paid to Frank Gray, agent.
