MRS. W. O. MORSE On Sunday, July 25th, the village of Campbellville and surrounding community sustained a great loss in the passing of Mrs. W. O. Morse at the age of eighty-four. Mrs. Morse was the daughter of the late George and Barbara Twiss of pioneer stock and widow of the late William Ormlston Morse. Although for some years her health had been impaired she remained an active member of the Women's Missionary Society of her church and the Women's Institute and during the war was active in the organization and carrying on of local war time activities. The marriage to take place in Acton Baptist Church, August 28th, at 3.00 p.m. ITALY'S TOBACCO SURPLUS Italy's 1947 tobacco crop of 143 million pounds was an all-time record and early reports indicate that, as the 1948 acreage is equal to that of 1947, this year's production may, with favourable weather conditions exceed that of last year. Before the war, with a yearly average output of 95.5 million pound, Italy was a net tobacco exporter of 7.6 million pounds annually. Due to a subsequent drop in production the country imported in 1947 about 18 million pounds from the U.S.A., 7.5 million from Bulgaria, Turkey and Greece, and 4.3 million from Latin-America; with exports amounting to only 3 million pounds Italy became a net importer of 28.6 million pounds of tobacco. However, the record crop in that year restored the export position with a reported 15 million pounds of leaf available for sale abroad and only a very limited quantity of Oriental-type tobacco to be imported.
