In 1947 the value of all poultry meats and eggs sold off Canadian farms or farm consumed was valued at \$235,850,000. This figure includes poultry meat of all kinds and eggs produced by urban and rural dwellers not strictly classed as farmers for Census purposes, and also the eggs for hatching. The comparable figure for 1946 was \$203,693,000.
