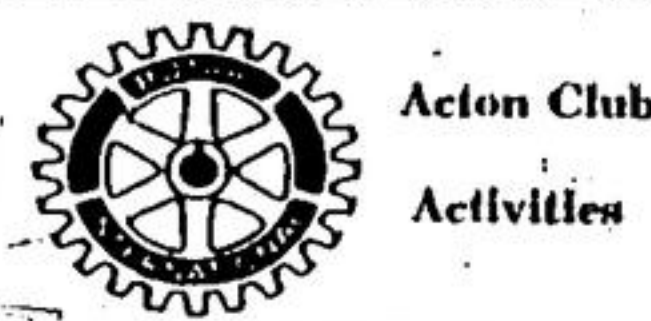
No Truce with Violence
