POST OFFICE DRIVERS' SAFETY CAMPAIGN

The United Kingdom Post Office recently lusted for display to its large staff of motor drivers and officers employed on telegraph delivery a new set of road safety posters. With its fleet of 25,000 motor vehicles covering a total of about 240,000 miles annually, and about 25,000 bicycles, Britain's Post Office is keenly interested in road safety and every encouragement is given to its drivers to enter the annual safety poster competition of the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents. In 1946, the latest year for which figures are available, 28,187 Post Office drivers entered the competition and 17,420 gained awards.
