"The Holy Scriptures" here spoken of doubtless refer to the Old Testament for, though many books of the New Testament had been written when Paul wrote these words, they were not when Timothy was "a babe".

These Old Testament writings were "holy" or "sacred" because they were "God-breathed (this is the literal interpretation of the words 'inspired of God") (v. 16). In them holy man spoke as they were "moved (literally 'carried along) by the Holy Spirit" (2 Pet. 1:21). Timothy had not only learned these things but had "been assured of" their certainty. He had this assurance because of his knowledge of those from whom ne had learned them and of the influence of those Scriptures upon their characters. He had been assured of them also because the Holy Scriptures had commended themselves as being of God as they do to everyone whose will is surrendered to God (Jno. 7:17).
