The food bill af many city families is so high, that, even with family allowances they find it difficult to finance houses which cost twice as much as they are worth. Farmers and landlords who provide food and houses are kept under controls which lessen the supply of both. Planners now propose to ease the pain of inflation by food subsidies. A great many people, who will add to the cost of both food and houses will be employed for thirty-six and one-half hours a week, to pacify the public. The bad conditions will grow progressively worse and the increased suffering caused by wrong remedies will require stronger dosages of subsidy sedatives which eventually will fail to work.
