Eramosa Council Make Grant to Rockwood Rink

Approval Given on Contract For Gravel For Roads

At the monthly meeting of Eramosa Township Council held in the town hall, Rockwood, a grant of \$150 was made to the Rockwood Community Club to finance the construction and maintenance of a skating rink.

The grant was made at the request of the Police Village Trustees and the amount is to be charged to the Police Village in the annual adjustment.

An additional grant of \$15 was made to the Canadian Legion in connection with Remembrance Day services.

A request from some merchants of Rockwood for a by-law providing for earlier closing hours was laid over for one month. The council felt that some details needed more investigation.

Accounts amounting to \$2,538.37 were passed and the receipt of \$10,000.07 as an interim grant on road expenditure for the year was reported.

Department of Highways' approval concerning the contract with Holman Construction Co. for 2,000 yards of crushed gravel, at 60 cents per yard, and with McKenzie Bros. for 2,000 yards of bit run gravel, at 44-cents per yard, was received.

The question of a heating system in the Township Garage was referred to the Deputy-Reeve E. H. Benham who will enquire into the matter.

The next meeting of Council will be held on November 1. Council will meet as a Court of Revision and for general business.
