#### PLUM CHUTNEY

(Requested by Mrs. T.J.)

3 quarts plums 3 large apples

I cup seeded raisins

1 teaspoon ground cloves

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

I teaspoon ground ginger 1 teaspoon curry powder

1 teaspoon dry mustard 6% cups granulated supar

teaspoon salt I quart cider vinegar

Remove pits from plums after wiping well. Wipe and chop apples, Combine with other ingredients in preserving kettle. Cook, uncovered, gently until thick (about 30 minutes) stirring frequently. Pour into sterilized jars. When cool, seal with hot parafin. Yields 2 pints.

#### FRUIT CHILLI SAUCE

(Requested by M. L.) 25 ripe tomatoes

5 peaches

5 pears

5 apples 5 onions

I sweet red pepper, diced

I sweet green pepper, diced 4 cup whole spices
