ed 2.6 per cent. There was, however, no significant change in the number of cows and helfers two years old and over kept mainly for milking purposes. Slight increases in Quebec, Ontario and Alberta were almost completely offset by

decreases in the other provinces. The number of horses on farms decreased 6.3 per cent from last year and a total of 1,904,900 has now fallen below 2 million for the first time since 1906. Sheep numbers decreased substantially to 2,250,800 almost 17 per cent below last year.


