SUFFICIENT LAND FOR FOOD — AUTHORITY

The world problem of feeding an increasing population is not so much a matter of productive soils as it is of developing methods and organizations to put the soil into production, states G. R. Snyder, agronomist in C-I-L's agricultural chemicals division.

Most people do not realize that potential new land is definitely available and increased production is possible on the land now being farmed, Mr. Snyder said. This can give us food significantly beyond that needed for an estimated world population in the year 1960.

The soil expert pointed out that 1.5 billion acres of unused land can be developed for crop production. A billion of these acres are in Africa, South America and on the large tropical islands. The remainder lies between the temperate regions and the frigid zones.

"It can be surmised from the foregoing that there is no excuse for the present food shortage in various parts of the world," the agricultural authority asserted. "If available land is developed to its maximum capacity and the existing cultivated land managed properly, there will be sufficient food for everyone in the future."

SEED TREATMENT HAS MANY BENEFITS

Four important benefits derived from treating seed with fungicides are outlined by C-I-L's agricultural chemicals division. They are:

- (1) Destroys seed-borne fungi which would otherwise reduce yield and quality of crop.
- (2) Combats soil inhabiting fungi which rot seed and destroy the seedlings.
- (3) Helps combat weeds by making possible good stands of vigorous crop plants.
- (4) In many cases it increases market value of crops, particularly grain, by making possible a greater germination.
