# Acton to-Have New Type of Telephone Service

System Will Be Changed To Common Battery Operation Next Spring

Telephone users in Acton will ree.ve improved service next spring when the exchange here is con verted from "magneto" to common battery operation, according to J. I Sanderson, Bell Telephone man-

ager for this region. Under the new system, a light on the operator's switchboard will go on whenever a subscriber lifts his receiver. This signal replaces the hand-crank signal, and laforms the operator that someone on that line wishes to make a call. Similarly, when a call is completed, the operator is automatically informed by the light, without the meed for "ringing off", so that the need for the hand-crank is

completely el minated The main benefits of the new system are faster handling of calls, quicker clearance of lines after conversations are finished and a reduction in the number of rings

heard on party lines. Many technical changes are required to complete the conversion of telephones here to common battery operation. In addition to the new switchboard to be installed in the exchange, a new and more compact -fype of telephone instrument will be installed for each subscriber, and extensive changes will be made in the wire and cable network connecting telephones with
